As a teenager, she started volunteering at the Masonic Home assisting seniors and was very hands on with grandparents. When her grandfather passed away, she took an interest and involvement in his insurance paperwork. “He was old school with how he handled his health and finances,” Deb says. “It really put me in a frame of mind to think about aging and health issues...and what it was really all about.”



Her senior year of high school, Deb scored an internship at Wellmark Blue Cross and Blue Shield. “Even then, I had a lot of involvement in the various areas of insurance, but didn't really fully understand what all of it meant at the time,” she says. After graduation she was Secretary to the Chairman of the Board, President and Vice President of Iowa's largest savings and loan - American Federal.

A New Love...and a New Opportunity

In 1978, Deb was fortunate to meet the love her life, Dan Sears. Little did she know that this new relationship would open the door to a life-long insurance career. Dan had a successful insurance agency and that same year, Deb became the first female career agent and was outnumbered nearly 50 to 1 by men. “They were very welcoming to me,” she says. “They encouraged me, trained me and I felt privileged to be associated with such a great group of respectful gentlemen.”

Being a woman didn't seem to hinder her client relationships either. “I worked very well with our clients – most of who were over age 65 seeking long-term care insurance,” Deb explains. “I felt like I was talking with my grandparents again, plus, I had the privilege to meet and insure a good share of my clients' children, leading me to three and sometimes four generation families.” Deb admits that the first few years were challenging simply for the fact that insurance is 100% commission and it takes three to five years to be completely self-supporting. Through persistence and goal setting, Deb's career continued to climb in those initial years... and so did her relationship with Dan. They were married on August 19, 1982 – on top of Pikes Peak – by military Chaplain George Fort from The Air Force Academy in Colorado Springs.

Today, Deb is president of Sears Insurance and the agency is celebrating 40 years. When Dan decided to retire, she had 20 years in the business and was fully prepared to become his successor. He still serves as her mentor in this business that started out with long-term care as its flagship product. Over the years, the agency has expanded to include a full line of health and life products for businesses and individuals.

A Champion in Work & Life

Deb sees the advantages on a personal and corporate level for healthy habits to be incorporated into daily life. From an insurance perspective, the agency promotes wellness programs through all their carriers and stresses the importance of keeping individuals, employers and employees healthy and productive. In her personal life, Deb strives to live by the same philosophy. “I enjoy walking around Gray's Lake to keep fit, and both Dan and I love to cook and prepare healthy meals.”

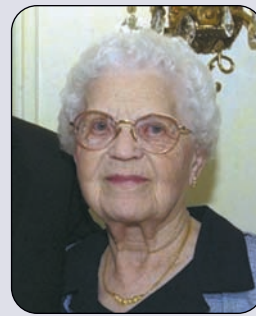

They’ve worked side by side, laughed and traveled the world together in their 30 years of marriage. “We share a deep faith and strong will that nothing is impossible.”
